Learning Day is Next Week: What Do You Need to Do?

Learning Day is coming up on Wednesday, October 25th, from 8 to 5 in Des Plaines, with the theme of "Advancing Racial Equity through Creating a Culture of Belonging and Connection." What do you need to do? If you teach or have office hours during this time, you must attend during those hours; of course, you are welcome to attend the entire day.

Funds Available

Planning on attending a professional conference this year? Thinking a document imager would help you teach synchronous classes from home? According to our contract (see section 3.10), adjuncts are entitled to a reimbursement of \$375 per academic year. This can be used for professional development activities, including professional association memberships, conference expenses, and technology used to support teaching. Technology has a \$200 limit. You need to get approval from your dean beforehand; submit this form to your division office for approval. Additional funds are available if you want to do the training through ION in online teaching.

Mandated Training Again

To remain in compliance with the <u>State of Illinois Department Human Rights (IDHR) mandate</u> regarding the prevention of sexual harassment, **all** Oakton employees must complete the annual **Sexual Harassment Prevention** refresher training; it takes just less than half an hour.

In addition, we need to take the Mandated Reporter for Child Abuse and Neglect training, a training that is required every three years. This training is about 40-55 minutes long. When you are finished, complete the "CANTS 22 Acknowledgement of Mandated Reporter Status" form. Complete this form and send it to the Human Resources Department where it will be kept in your personnel file. Please click this link for detailed instructions on how to access the training modules.

These two trainings must be completed by November 30, 2023. They are provided by Vector Solutions, which will keep your training record and evidence of completion. You can also download a certificate for your records. Do not send the certificates to HR or CPD; they have it already. The emails that you are receiving will stop when you finish the training.

In Michigan, Some Adjuncts Have Been Outsourced

In an effort to save costs, several community colleges in Michigan are using Edustaff, a Michigan based staffing firm that also places K-12 substitute teachers, for their adjuncts. Rather than being employees of the college, newly hired adjuncts will work for Edustaff; existing adjuncts can opt in or not.

What is the advantage for the colleges? The colleges say that they can offer better wages to their employees in an affordable way and that the colleges can also 'reduce its cost of delivering services to its learners...' How does it save money? The colleges can avoid paying into a Michigan retirement system for community college system employees; instead, the college is raising adjunct's pay by about 7%. In addition, as Edustaff employees, adjuncts receive a 401K and health benefits. Read more about it here and in this article from Inside Higher Ed.
