Get Your Preference Forms for Spring In

According to our contract, the time-table for submitting Spring preference forms is as follows:

- **By 9/28/23**: Adjunct faculty return the completed form to their chair within two weeks of the notification.
- **By 10/16/23**: Chairs/coordinators provide notice of assignment to at least 80% of their adjunct faculty.
- By 10/30/23: Adjunct faculty accept or decline the assignment within two weeks of the notification.

1/3 of Our Students May Be Food Insecure

In 2018, 31% of Oakton's students reported low or very low food security in a local survey, the Illinois Course Materials Survey: Student Perspective. Nationally, food insecure students skip buying course materials at significantly higher rates than other students (.S. PIRG, 2021). Haven't we all experienced students trying to keep up with a class but without having bought a textbook? To learn more about our students' experiences with the cost of course materials and their impact, Oakton College is participating in a state-wide research project the "Illinois Course Materials Survey: Student Perspective."

Please consider sharing this survey with students in class or via email. The voluntary survey will take between 5-10 minutes. To participate, students must have been 18 years of age or older at the start of the fall semester.

Thinking of Retiring?

Retiring from Oakton can be a confusing business. The AFA is working with the administration to come up with a step-by-step guide to retirement. What do you need to do first? When will you know the amount of your pension? When will the pension start? A guide to how to retire is coming.

The AFA is also working on -

We all know how complicated our schedules are at Oakton. Classes may be 16-week or 8-weeks – 4 weeks. They may have labs or not. They may involve a lot of writing or not. We also have office hours.

A formula is needed to convert our work into something that Oakton can use to accurately communicate our work to SURS (State University Retirement System - the state organization that administers our pensions). For a long time, the formula Oakton has used has not accurately represented our work. This formula needs to be clear, understandable, and fair as it is the basis for what our pensions will be. The AFA has been working with the administration to come up with a formula agreeable to both sides – the administration and adjuncts.
